LOOSE PARTS

What are Loose parts and how do they benefit a child's learning?


Boxes, sticks and blankets all seem like such simple objects, but they are packed with so much potential and limitless possibilities fueling imagination and creativity.

Children are innovative, especially with loose parts. Open-ended materials help them to ask questions, get creative and collaborate with others. We can enhance children's natural curiosity by introducing boxes, rocks, shells, pine cones, detergent lids, etc. to expand on critical thinking and supports physical, socio-emotional and cognitive development.

We hope you can see the benefits and help us in collecting items. A list has been posted by each classroom door to help you keep an eye out for these items that usually get shoved out of site.

We ask that you keep a few things in mind- items should be in good enough condition to re-use or upcycle, items should be safe for children to handle as is or with minimal modifications and lastly items should be of no cost- think about items you normally recycle or use as a hand me down- someone's junk is another person's treasure!

We all got to choose a new fruit for tasting. Some favourites were the mango and golden berries. Then children practiced their cutting skills as we chopped up our fruit for fruit salad and smoothies. We have been reading a couple of new books this month. The way I act written by Steve Metzger and illustrated by Janan Cain. This books focuses on how we behave. It has given us some new words such as considerate, respectful and persistent. Have you filled a bucket today? Written by Carol McCloud and illustrated by David Messing is another book that offer messages of how to treat others. You may hear your child talk about filling and dipping into each other's buckets. This comes from the book. It refers to us making other feel happy when we fill their bucket and how making someone feel sad will be dipping into their bucket. This message is to help children understand how our own behaviour can effect others around us. We are continuing to work on our fine motor skills with writing and drawing actives such as drawing vehicle pictures and writing our own names. We have been doing cutting actives as well. Cutting up play dough pasta or cutting out shapes to glue together to make vehicles. All in preparation for Kindergarten!

Preschool 3 Adventures



We have been enjoying a beautiful Spring, and have seen so many changes in our outdoor nature space. A lot of our outdoor play has been inquiry-based, as we use our observation skills to notice new sights and smells, such as new flower blossoms or even bird poop! We have been asking lots of questions, making hypotheses based on our previous knowledge, and then manipulating objects to see what will happen!

Why We Use Loose Parts: Think about a gallery or a museum, which exhibits are you more drawn to: the paintings on blank walls or the interactive pieces? While the paintings are undoubtedly beautiful or invoking in some way, it is always the interactive exhibitions, the ones which I can engage with physically which draw my attention, inviting me to come and experiment.

We want our learning environment to reflect our image of the child. If you believe the child to be inquisitive and creative, competent and capable, intelligent and whole, then you will create environments which reflect this.

An environment which is rich in open-ended materials and real materials, invokes children to experiment, engage, construct and invent; invites them to tinker, to manipulate and to play.

In the month ahead we plan to build on this play with continued incorporation of math and literacy, as well as sensory-based play both indoors and out! We are hoping to create a sensory garden, so if you come across any interesting smelling, looking, or even sounding plants when you are gardening, we can use them! Some days will be MESSY! On rainy days we always love playing in the mud and puddles, and looking for insects, but we also have our 3rd Annual Mud Race planned this month! Please come prepared with old clothes or bathing suit to wear to school!


Don't forget there are a lot of PA Days in June, sign up your child on the kinder bulletin board under the proper school board.
