Back to School


Warm greetings to all families new and returning or just back from vacation! It is our pleasure to be your choice for child care.



September brings a sense of new beginnings filled with new or rekindled friendships, routines and experiences. Although

it is sad to say goodbye to so many families each September with children moving on to school, it is so nice to see so many new faces as well. We look forward to getting to know you and your child, making new memories and sharing experiences with you all.

Over the summer months there was a lot of attention and detail paid to the playgrounds. Both preschool and toddler playgrounds were carefully curated to extend the learning to the outdoors. If you have not yet done so, please make sure you stop by the “forest” just outside of the preschool playground. This area is a non-structured play space that is kept natural, using only basic materials that are open-ended and encourage imaginative play. This allows for endless possibilities in terms of learning and programming. If you have a skill such as building/constructing to share or have time to assist us in evolving this space, we would gladly welcome you lending a helping hand. This would be a great opportunity for children to see bridging of relationships, adult problem-solving, co-operation and team work.



Speaking of teamwork, we would like to give a great big thank you and way to go to the many staff it takes to run Paramount! Everyone from the frontline permanent staff to the volunteers, students and Church staff all working together to make this place “A Happy Place to Grow”. We could do it without such great people! For new families to the centre, there are many new faces to get to know, that can sometimes seem confusing. All permanent staff take a special part in your child’s day in some capacity. We consider ourselves a very big family that work together to get everything done in a day. Your child’s classroom teachers are scheduled to work the bulk of the day, with a float staff and a few split shift staff opening and closing the centre. Rest assured that we will do our best to deliver important messages in person or use HiMama as a back up to that.



HiMama is a great tool that helps us document milestones and data about health and well-being. First and foremost, educators are working hard to build a connection with your child- building trust and encouraging participation in the program. Once that is established, children will feel comfortable in the environment and have the confidence to explore and learn. This is when the learning and documenting can take place. Simple reports are sent daily and our goal is to capture a special moment periodically to share to with you. Our priority is hands on interaction as part of How Does Learning Happen- Ontario's Pedagogy for the Early Years, specifically the areas of Well- Being and Belonging, to be followed by Engagement and Expression.

TODDLER

September is a time for new experiences and a new start for some. It is also a continuation of current learning interests, responsive relationships and the four foundations of learning. Our goal as educators is that every child has a sense of belonging, sense of self, can express themselves in many ways and be in an engaged learner. Caring and nurturing relationships and being respectful to the interests and needs of each child are our beliefs and how we support children to achieve their full potential.

Last spring our outdoor playground transitioned to an outdoor learning environment. Items were added to engage children in active play and meaningful exploration. The summer proved this transition to be a positive one. On so many occasions the children connected to others and the natural environment. We will continue to make additions in the fall for more shared exploration.

It is our privilege to co-learn with each child and we look forward to many learning experiences. Remember we have an open-door policy so please feel free to be a part of the classroom. We thank all toddler parents for their ongoing support.



Help keep the germs away by washing your child's hands before you dropping them off in the classroom and again before you go home.


